NASPAG Advocacy Committee Statement on Accessibility and Equity for Opill

The North American Society for Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology (NASPAG) has served as a leader in advocacy for unrestricted, unbiased, and evidence-based reproductive care for adolescents. We recognize and emphasize the potential health, social, and economic implications of mistimed or unplanned pregnancy during adolescence and have previously released a statement supporting the availability of oral progestin-only contraceptive pills to adolescents.

NASPAG supports over-the-counter availability of a progestin-only contraceptive pill at an affordable price. The goal of over-the-counter contraception pills is to improve access to safe, effective birth control. This is especially important to adolescents who naturally face more barriers to accessing high-quality reproductive health care compared to adults. Some of the most significant challenges come in the form of healthcare cost and confidential contraceptive access. We believe in strongly promoting a cost-effective strategy for enhancing access to birth control, particularly for adolescents, to ensure that financial constraints do not pose a barrier to the realization of its potential benefits.
